EXECUTIVE SUMMARY FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

In 2025, RRSA reached over 1,688 people in Bidibidi through three independent yet synergistic pilots: **The Green Camp Project: Empowered youth as Climate Champions.** By blending environmental advocacy with indigenous knowledge, these leaders spearheaded community reforestation and e-waste initiatives.

The Refugee Archives Project: Secured narrative sovereignty for South Sudanese heritage. Refugees acted as cultural custodians, digitizing oral histories to ensure memory remains community-owned.

Digital Action for Community Empowerment: Focused on ethical storytelling training. This initiative equipped members with the tools to produce dignified, authentic content, countering stereotypes and amplifying refugee-led solutions and developed RRSA story checklist.

Together, these projects transform refugees from subjects of aid into environmental and digital leaders.

Project Snapshot

Green Camp Project

The team mobilized youth in Bidibidi Refugee Settlement to participate in environmental restoration and distributed over 500 tree seedlings to encourage re-greening of degraded areas. It also raised environmental awareness through community storytelling, integrating climate education into their grassroots media work. The project has created a shared community space where refugees engage as storytellers, peacebuilders and environmental caretakers, strengthening ownership of local environmental action.


Refugee Archive: Culture in Commons

RRSA conducted three community workshops in Bidibidi Refugee Settlement, documenting cultural heritage from five tribes, targeting two participants per tribe to be equipped with knowledge and cultural documentation and become active stakeholders in the online and living archive for the next generation. Oral histories, songs, and traditional practices were digitized and published on open-access platforms using Creative Commons licenses.

Digital Action for Community Empowerment (DACE)

The program strengthened youth skills in digital storytelling and ethical media use.

Through a short intensive course and field practice, participants received valuable skills in digital and ethical storytelling and learned soft skills in recording, editing, and publishing community stories for impact.

In June 2025, RRSA implemented a localized campaign aimed at empowering refugee voices through storytelling dialogue in Bidibidi Refugee Settlement, Yumbe District, Uganda. The campaign sought to spotlight refugee experiences, foster advocacy through personal narratives and promote community-led dialogue and awareness.

From the community



My name is Denma Susan. I represent the women's section. I am originally from Muru and married into Madi. I was glad to attend the cultural documentation training held in Bidibidi Refugee Settlement. This was the first training of its kind since I arrived here. I learned how neighboring tribes organize ceremonies, how they pass down stories, and which traditions need safeguarding. The sessions also helped me reflect on customs in my own community and to separate what to preserve from what we might change.

I thank Reliable Refugee Storytellers Association for organizing the training and for working directly with our community. The knowledge we gained will help us document our culture and hand it on to the next generation.



I participated in the DACE training, which strengthened my professional capacity in ethical storytelling and media documentation. The training equipped me with practical skills in responsibly approaching sources, conducting structured interviews, gathering accurate information, recording high-quality video and audio content, and editing audio and videos for effective storytelling. I sincerely appreciate the Reliable Refugee Storytelling Association for organizing and implementing the DACE Program, as the knowledge and skills gained have enabled me to contribute meaningfully to community storytelling and media initiatives with professionalism and integrity.





In 2023 RRSA reached 20 youth as direct beneficiaries for Livelihood program supported by Global Refugee Youth Network (GRYN) where they got support in land renting that would aid them cultivate crops to supplement their food.

RRSA together with Kiryandongo Video Advocates (KVA) used facilitated community film screenings as a dynamic and inclusive tool to raise awareness, foster dialogue, and drive action on two intersecting issues affecting refugee communities in Uganda. 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
